The U.S. Food and Drug Administration, which has regulatory authority, has issued guidance urging more diversity in clinical trials.

Education, training and scholarships for students from underrepresented communities will build a new and diverse pipeline of doctors, nurses and health care practitioners.



RELATIONSHIPS PATIENT ADVOCATES TO SERVE AS AMBASSADORS

Patient advocates have an established rapport with community members and can serve as connectors among clinical trial participants, researchers, and other medical facilities and resources.

Clinical trial sponsors will ultimately improve access for underserved communities by offering them education and innovative diagnostic and treatment options that can help fight and prevent disease.
